- ▶ The **J. M. Long Foundation pledged \$250,000** to underwrite construction costs for the Center for Ocean Health. Professor **Gary Griggs**, director of the Institute of Marine Sciences, collaborated with **Sarah Schuster** of the Physical and Biological Sciences Development Office on this grant.
- ► Friends of the UCSC Library board member **Mark Engel** (Cowell '75) established the **Norman O. Brown Classics Endowment** to honor the inspirational pioneer faculty member. The endowment addresses a major campus need for increased support for library materials in classics.

**UNIVERSITY CENTER UPDATE** The University Center opening was a terrific success. To date, more than 85 people have become charter members. **PARTICIPATION IN FUNDRAISING EVENTS** Recent faculty involvement in fundraising-related activities for UCSC include:

- ► The ARCS (Achievement Rewards for College Scientists) Foundation annual scholarship awards event, held February 4, was attended by Chancellor M.R.C. Greenwood, Associate Vice Provost and Dean Lynda Goff, Dean Sung-Mo ("Steve") Kang, Professor Russell Flegal, and Senior Lecturer John Wilkes. This year nine UCSC students received the prestigious science and engineering scholarships.
- ▶ Provost **Campbell Leaper**, College Administrative Officer **Deana Slater**, and the staff of Colleges 9 and 10 organized an extremely successful "Family Day" on February 8. Approximately 260 people attended, including many parents of Colleges 9 and 10 students.
- ▶ Dean Edward Houghton, Professors Anatole Leiken and Nicole Paiement, and Lecturer Roy Malan attended a concert showcasing the UCSC Resident String Ensemble (RSE) and honoring donors who contributed to the RSE scholarship program. The event was hosted at the Corralitos home of campus friends Sam and Terese Wright.
- ▶ UCSC Foundation trustee **Betsy Woolpert** hosted a lunch with members of the south Santa Cruz County agriculture community to highlight the work of the Center for Agroecology and Sustainable Food Systems. The featured speaker was Professor **Carol Shennan**. Also in attendance were Chancellor **M.R.C. Greenwood** and Dean **Martin Chemers**.

- ▶ Foundation Center (http://foundationcenter.org): Contains listings and links to foundations and corporate grant makers and resources for foundation research and proposal writing. Use the "Virtual Classroom" (http://fdncenter.org/learn/classroom/index.html) to access online tutorials on grantseeking and using the Foundation Center web site. Visit the "RFP Bulletin" page (http://fdncenter.org/pnd/rfp) and subscribe to its weekly e-mail alert; the page also offers a listing of RFPs and award bulletins with links to source announcements.
- ▶ Community of Science Funding Alert (http://cos.com/services/funding.shtml): A weekly e-mail alert of public and private funding opportunities; the alert may be personalized to filter content. As UCSC is an institutional subscriber to COS, faculty may register with COS at no extra cost.

▶ Foundation Directory Online: Lists the largest 10,000 foundations and over 150,000 grants and is searchable by multiple parameters. Access is limited to divisional development offices because campus use is through a feebased subscription. Contact your development office for assistance.

## REFINING STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS

Scheduled for completion by late spring, the project will continue to be guided by the steering committee comprised of Vice Chancellor Francisco Hernandez; Deans Edward Houghton, Sung-Mo ("Steve") Kang, David Kliger and Cathy Sandeen; Professors Michael Cowan and Tony Fink; Foundation trustee and alumnus Loren Steck; and Alumni Council member Ken Doctor. Ex-officio members include Vice Chancellor Ronald Suduiko, Associate Vice Chancellor Elizabeth Irwin, and Director of Public Information Jim Burns.

# EXPANDING RELATIONSHIPS AND ADVOCACY

Below are a few examples of how faculty are helping to build positive relationships for UC Santa Cruz:

- ➤ Professor **John Thompson**, director of the STEPS Institute, participated in a community open house and appreciation reception for former Assemblymember and Speaker Pro Tem **Fred Keeley**. At the event, Chancellor **M.R.C. Greenwood** announced the establishment of an annual Keeley lecture series on environmental policy.
- ▶ Representative Anna Eshoo, whose 14th District now includes north Santa Cruz County, visited campus on January 10. She met with Chancellor Greenwood, Executive Vice Chancellor and Campus Provost John Simpson, Vice Chancellors Robert Miller and Ronald Suduiko, and Deans Martin Chemers, David Kliger, Cathy Sandeen, and Frank Talamantes. Representative Eshoo received briefings from Professors David Deamer, Lindsay Hinck, and Don Smith, and from Lisa Hunter, associate director of public education and outreach for the Center for Adaptive Optics.
- ▶ On February 10, Vice Chancellor for Research **Robert Miller** and Associate Vice Chancellor for Research **Burney Le Boeuf** made a presentation to department heads of the City of Santa Cruz and other public officials on the economic impact of research. On February 19, they will participate in UC Research Day in Sacramento.
- ► Through the UCSC Speakers Bureau, **James Lewis** of the Chemistry Department spoke to the Watsonville Kiwanis Club and Professor **Alan Christy** of the History Department gave a talk to the American Association of University Women.
- ▶ Professor **Tricia Rose** emceed the Martin Luther King Jr. convocation on January 21, featuring civil rights activist James Lawson Jr.; **Chancellor Greenwood** also spoke at the event. Professor **Paul Ortiz** moderated the next day's panel discussion, with Professor **Carolyn Martin Shaw** and two students as panelists.
- ▶ Arts & Lectures Director **Michelle Witt** is teaching a Porter College class entitled *Sound Art: Experiencing Live Music*. Her January 24 class was held in the home of Porter Provost **David Evan Jones** with a private perform-

ance by visiting artists, the Arden Trio.

▶ Professor **Jonathan Beecher** will deliver the 36th annual Faculty Research Lecture on Tuesday, March 11. Presented by the Santa Cruz Division of the Academic Senate, his talk is entitled "Two Concepts of Utopia."

# SHOWCASING RESEARCH AND OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS

**NEWS MEDIA COVERAGE** Disseminating news about faculty research findings and achievements is one of the primary jobs of the Public Information Office (PIO). Through a variety of media channels (e.g., press releases, *Currents, Review*, and the UCSC web site) the PIO team regularly showcases the talented individuals who comprise UCSC, resulting in international, national, and regional coverage of UCSC. Below are recent examples of faculty whose achievements have garnered media attention.

- Asteroid expert **Erik Asphaug** was quoted in an article in the *New York Times* about scientists' ideas for how best to stop an asteroid heading toward Earth, should one be discovered.
- ▶ The Los Angeles Times tapped **Brent Haddad** of environmental studies for comment on a high-stakes move by the Bush administration to resolve a long-standing water dispute between Imperial Irrigation District and coastal southern California.
- ► The *Washington Times* discussed the welfare-reform work of **Rebecca London**, research associate with the Center for Justice, Tolerance, and Community.
- ► Hindi and Urdu lecturer **John Mock** was quoted in the *Atlanta Journal and Constitution*, as well as by Cox News Service, about the current political situation in Pakistan.
- ▶ Manuel Pastor of the Center for Justice, Tolerance, and Community was quoted several times in *San Jose Mercury News* stories about the Mayfair neighborhood of San Jose, an immigrant enclave where most residents live paycheck to paycheck.
- ▶ Linguistics professor **Geoffrey Pullum** was coauthor of a full-page opinion piece in the January 3 issue of the *Chronicle of Higher Education*.
- Astronomer **Stephen Thorsett** was quoted in an article in the *Washington Post* about a new NASA satellite to study supernovae.
